Einstein: An Extraordinary Man

With the verification of his General Theory of Relativity in 1919, Albert Einstein had become an international celebrity. In 1921, he visited the United States with Chaim Weizmann to raise money for the Hebrew University. He also gave lectures in London, Paris, Zurich, Oslo, Copenhagen, Leyden, Prague and Vienna.

Two years later, in February 1923, Albert Einstein attended a reception in Tel Aviv. At the reception, then-mayor Meir Dizengoff and members of the City Council named him an honorary citizen. After the reception, Einstein wrote in his diary that the accomplishments of Jews in a few short years "cause the highest admiration."

In 1923, while visiting Jerusalem, Einstein wrote in his diary that he was about to visit the Hebrew University. Einstein thought that a Jewish university could be a great idea. He said that although Israel was a growing country, it could be a center for Jewish thought, which would "make the diverse communities of Israel come to life."

Einstein won the Nobel Prize for Physics and he did many remarkable things. He helped convince President Franklin D. Roosevelt to start the Manhattan Project to create an atomic bomb. He also warned of the need for nuclear arms control after World War II and became a leader of the Government World concept.

Einstein wrote in his diary about other subjects and over time, Einstein's humanitarianism tempered his views on race, ethnicity and national character.

Since Einstein was Anti-Nationalist, he was against the idea of a Jewish State. He continued to say, however, that his relationship to the Jewish people "is my strongest human bond."
