Cultured pearls are less expensive because they aren't as rare as natural pearls. It's believed that only 1% of the pearls used in jewelry are natural. This is because natural pearls are hard to find. The world's most expensive pearl costs \$100 million. It is the largest pearl known to exist. It measures 66 cm in length and weighs over 31 kg. A fisherman found the pearl and kept it under his bed for ten years. He believed it was a good luck charm.

Pearls are one of the official birthstones of the month of June. Pearls are considered to symbolize clarity, loyalty, and purity. This birthstone is a perfect gift for a friend or relative.
