No Sleeping, only fun!

Could Pillow Fighting Become An Olympic Sport?

On 29 January 2022, a new combat sport moved out of the bedroom and into the boxing ring. Recently a new Pillow Fight Championship (PFC) held its first live event in Florida. Sixteen men and eight women, who have backgrounds in mixed martial arts and boxing, took part in the first edition of the showdown.

Steve Williams had a dream of turning the childhood game into a professional sport. He said that PFC brings all the drama and adrenaline of hand-to-hand fighting without the violence and blood of MMA (Mixed Martial Arts) or boxing. Even though things are not as violent as in other fighting sports, Williams promised there is still plenty of action to enjoy because it's serious and it's a real fight using special pillows.

Even though the men and women who have taken part in the event mostly come from the tough worlds of MMA and boxing, the PFC is still something that kids can watch. The only difference between these fights and MMA fights is that nobody gets hurt. The fighters don't like to get hurt, and there are many viewers who don't want to see people get seriously hurt. Steve Williams believes people want to see good competition but not violence. The fact that so many people grew up hitting their brothers or sisters, friends, and parents with pillows makes the sport relatable. He hopes this will help to get new people interested in the sport.

According to a post from the International Modern Pentathlon Union (UIPM) Athletes Committee on Instagram, eight disciplines have been suggested for the

Olympic Games in 2028 and pillow fighting is one of them. Steve Williams says that you can call it an alternative sport, but it's going to have mainstream appeal which is why it is a good choice for the Olympics.
