The Most Expensive Dog in the World

It is not cheap to have a dog. Their food costs money, and so does their equipment. A dog needs a place to sleep, some toys, at least two bowls for food and water. It also needs a leash and some dogs need winter clothing. Visits to the vet cost money, and also visits to the grooming salon. It costs about three thousand shekels to keep a dog for a year.

Some people also spend money when they buy their dog. Usually, if you take a dog from a rescue shelter, it doesn't cost a lot. But some people prefer to buy a dog. That can be expensive. One of the most expensive dogs in the world is the Tibetan Mastiff. One Tibetan Mastiff can cost between fifteen and seventeen thousand dollars.

What is a Tibetan Mastiff? You can understand from its name that it comes from Tibet, a country in the Far East. The word "Mastiff" is used in European languages to describe big dogs. It is a big breed; it has long fur (because it comes from a cold place) and it helps people because it's used as a herding dog. It is also very good with people and children, and can be a part of a family.
