Even though she is not even a teenager, she is a martial arts master. But as good as she is, Mindy is still a young girl who occasionally displays the same emotions typical for her age.

The famous Black Widow, Natasha Romanova, is a highly-trained Russian agent who defected to the West and was recruited by Nick Fury and SHIELD to use her abilities for good. She's a superspy and master of disguise with unbelievable fighting skills.

Clint Barton (Hawkeye) and Oliver Queen (Green Arrow) are another two famous superheroes without power. Both men are surrounded by superpowered peers yet have managed to stand beside the best of them, just using sticks, string, and some creative arrowheads in battle.

So you don't need superpowers to be a superhero. While the likes of Wonder Woman, Superman and Spider-Man are famous for their superhuman abilities, there are many heroes who have nothing but incredible training, high-tech gadgetry to help them.
