Be Prepared

Did you know that the Scouts is the biggest youth movement in the world?

Every Tuesday and Friday afternoon you can see many kids and teens on their way to their Scouts meetings all around Israel. You can recognize them by their khaki uniforms with special badges sewn on them and their neckerchiefs that come in several colors. The Israel Boy and Girl Scouts Federation is the largest youth movement in the country. There are over 90,000 members who take part in the movement's activities and proudly believe in its motto "Be prepared!"

The Israeli Scouts are a part of the international Scouts youth movement, which was founded in 1907 in England. The movement's founder, Robert Baden-Powell, was an army officer who wanted to teach young people important survival skills. His military experience taught him how important it was to know to be independent while spending time outdoors. So he started a movement where children learned various skills, such as camping in nature, hiking and surviving in the outdoors. He put a lot of emphasis on sportive activities and getting to know and to respect nature.

Over the years, the Federation has adapted its activities and core values. The movement has a set of codes called Scouts Law. These codes define behavior for the movement's members. For example, the Scouts need to be loyal to their country. They need to be useful and help others. Another important code says "A Scout is a friend to animals". There are more codes that define who a Scout is and how he or she must behave. All 40 million Scouts members across 223 countries must follow these codes.
